Gearhart is using his proximity to Ferguson to research how the community is bouncing back from that period of turmoil, as well as how implicit bias informs outside views of its residents. He is about a third of the way through a study examining the effectiveness of efforts undertaken by the Ferguson Community Empowerment Center to address the challenges faced by the city's residents and also getting started on work examining policeresident relationships in the wake of the Brown shooting. He presented his progress at the Early Career Research Symposium

in October, where he found he wasn't the only UMSL researcher

"It was really powerful to see that we have people doing projects
