St. Vincent Home for Children has expanded its services with the opening of the new Sister Mary Ann Eultgen Youth <u>Development Center</u> within its premises at 7401 Florissant Rd in Normandy. Occupying more than 5,200 square feet of newly renovated space within St. Vincent, the Center includes a teaching kitchen, a classroom, game and exercise rooms, a multipurpose room, and even a sound studio. It will allow St. Vincent to provide the only life skills and recreation programs




