"But he was trying to make his life better. This is a representation of how people from places in poverty try to change their lives but stuff catches up to them."

Four Municipalities in the 24:1 Community Win Municipal Tree Grants Four municipalities within the 24:1 Community have received an award of up to \$10,000 from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) through its Tree Resource Improvement and Maintenance (TRIM) cost-share grant program. The municipalities are Cool Valley, Glen Echo Park, Uplands Park, and Greendale. Beyond Housing wrote grants in coordination with 13 municipalities within the 24:1 Community for this year's TRIM

TRIM is a competitive grant that helps communities provide safe

and healthy trees. The participating municipalities jointly bid the work to make state and local taxpayer dollars go further. This


