This is exciting news as the Teen Center of Excellence is one of the first in the country. The facility is over 26,000 square feet and will offer a variety of different resources for teens ages 12-18. The newly built \$12.4 million center located on West Florissant Ave. will house an innovation center, recording studio, a nutrition education center, outdoor garden, gymnasium, intellectual commons, auditorium, activity center, office space and a music and art studio.

After school and summer programs will be provided in the North County area. Programing will emphasize education and workforce development, (college tours, ACT/SAT prep, tutoring, job readiness, internships and summer employment) STEAM (visual & performing arts, coding, app creation, robotics) and, leadership and civic engagement (community service, character programs and advocacy training).
