Believe it: Literacy lab opens in Barack Obama School

The Normandy Schools Collaborative is now home to a Believe Project literacy lab, an initiative of the St. Louis Black Authors of Children's Literature [STLBACL.]. A ribbon cutting ceremony was held at Barack Obama School on Sept. 29, 2022.

Nike's Black Community Commitment initiative and the Nike St. Louis Air MI Black Employee Network chose STLBACL as a Black Community Commitment 2022 grantees, and it received \$50,000 to support the literacy program. The funds provided will support teacher training, a library of diverse titles (ninety percent of the characters or authors featured in the reading space will be people of color), and a colorful mural by St. Louis-based artist Bill Williams. "Transit Stop Transformation Project" at the North Hanley Transit Center Opens to the Public

Citizens for Modern Transit (CMT), AARP in St. Louis and Metro Transit – in partnership with St. Louis REALTORS®, Employment Connection and Bywater Development Group –unveiled the "Transit Stop Transformation" Project at the North Hanley Transit Center, located at 4300 North Hanley Road...The opening comes after a months-long process of getting input from transit riders, area residents, elected officials and stakeholders through a series of virtual design workshops, surveys and community events – and completing construction.

"Transit stops are synonymous with gray space, and when we arrived at this site, it certainly wasn't the exception," said Kimberly Cella, executive director of Citizens for Modern Transit, who helped spearhead the transformation. "Yet today, transit riders are welcomed to a colorful, inviting, interactive and vibrant space full of energy."...The revitalized space features shade structures, seating, musical elements, ground murals and window designs. The project reflects the diverse group of riders who utilize this significant MetroLink and MetroBus connection point in unincorporated St. Louis County. It serves as an extension to the ongoing efforts made by the partners to raise awareness about placemaking around transit, which is a concept that transforms places people simply pass through in route to their next destination – like MetroLink and MetroBus Transit Centers – into active, engaging corridors that connect individuals and neighborhoods by offering access to products, services, activities and green space. UMSL Honors College Students participate in Pine Lawn and Kinloch community service events

Dr. Rob Wilson, an assistant teaching professor and community engagement coordinator for the Pierre Laclede Honors College at UMSL, organized two community service events this fall.

The first was the Honors Day of Service which has taken place once a semester since 2020. On October 15 the college teamed up with community partner Beyond Housing to perform community service in Pine Lawn. About 50 UMSL students, staff, and faculty members participated in mulching, tree-trimming, picking up trash, and cleaning the water basin. Reflecting on the Honors Day of Service, Dr. Wilson said, "I believe it's important for students to give back in the area where they work, live, and play."

The second volunteer event took place in Kinloch. On October 23, the UMSL and Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville chapters of Alpha Phi Omega, a national service fraternity, working with the UMSL student organization Artists Anonymous, cleared overgrown land removing weeds, trees, and shrubs to uncover an area that used to have a mural. The group plans to return to Kinloch to finish clearing the site of a future daycare that will also have a mural on its wall. Artists Anonymous will work on restoring both murals.

Dr. Wilson said that he wants to encourage students to get out of the classroom and make a difference in the community around them. "It's easy to go to class and go home; but there are some amazing students who want to do more and ask themselves, "What else can we do to give back?" he noted. He gives much of the credit to his students. "I coordinate [the events], but the students are the ones that do the amazing work alongside our community partners."

UMSL Virtual Literacy Clinic Now Taking Applications

The UMSL Literacy Clinic provides tutoring to K-12 students who need support in reading, writing, and spelling. Teachers will administer literacy assessments and design personalized sessions that focus on strengthening skills using evidence based approaches to literacy instruction.

Students who are accepted will be matched with an educator for twelve (12), one-on-one or small group literacy sessions, held after school and/or in the evening. Each instructional program is designed with students' cultural, familial, and linguistic resources and strengths in mind.

Participation in the virtual literary clinic is free and consists of approximately 12 one-hour Zoom sessions in the afternoon or evening. Sessions begin every August and January. Read more about this program and sign up soon.
