Missouri Sen. Brian Williams touts unprecedented investment in UMSL, north St. Louis County

Dozens of elected officials and community members gathered on a recent afternoon at the Patient Care Center on the University of Missouri–St. Louis campus to celebrate an unprecedented investment from the State of Missouri in north St. Louis County.

Missouri Sen. Brian Williams and Chancellor Kristin Sobolik welcomed the excited crowd and detailed investments aimed at revitalizing St. Louis County, including a \$40 million investment toward the redevelopment of UMSL's campus. "We're here today to talk about a very important achievement here in this state," Williams said. "The governor signed budget bills that

CLIMB Program provides area high school students hands-on research experience in UMSL labs

Thirteen interns from the Hazelwood, Jennings, Ritenour, Riverview Gardens and University City school districts took part in this summer's program.

Patricia Parker, the E. Desmond Lee Endowed Professor of Zoological Studies, established the CLIMB (the University of Missouri–St. Louis' Collaborative Laboratory Internships and Mentoring Blueprint) Program as a partnership with administrators in the Jennings School District in 2015. They wanted to help foster that level of scientific interest in high-ability but low-opportunity students who might not otherwise have had chances to receive comparable hands-on lab experience....After operating the program in a virtual format in 2020 and doing a group research project on bee pollination outdoors in community gardens last spring and summer because of COVID-19, CLIMB returned to its original format this summer. UMSL students play valuable roles in furthering the mission of St. Louis-based Food Outreach

Two current students at the University of Missouri–St. Louis are playing pivotal roles in addressing food insecurity for those living with chronic illnesses in the St. Louis area. Leizel Thomas, who is studying organizational leadership, and Noah Young, who is studying business administration, both work at Food Outreach, a St. Louis-based organization that provides comprehensive nutritional services to people living with HIV and cancer. A pilot program for veterans with diabetes is also underway. Thomas, a full-time employee since November 2019, serves as Nutrition Center coordinator and assistant chef, while Young, a part-time employee since February 2021, is Food Outreach’s lead van driver.

Despite serving 1,800 clients across 160 zip codes in Missouri and Illinois, Food Outreach has a staff of just 14 employees, plus about 800 volunteers. Director of Client Services Kathy Spencer says this means every employee must wear a lot of hats, and that’s certainly true of both Thomas and Young. [Read more.](#)
