USDA to build new Food Safety and Inspection Service Midwestern Laboratory in Normandy

STL Partnership Promise Zone, Hannah Nixon, May 31, 2023

The <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture</u> celebrated the groundbreaking of a new <u>Food Safety and Inspection Service</u> (<u>FSIS</u>) Midwestern Laboratory in Normandy, Missouri on May 24. The lab will replace the current testing facility that is located in the Goodfellow neighborhood. The <u>General Services</u> <u>Administration</u> (GSA), which manages properties on behalf of other government agencies, signed a 20-year lease for the USDA site with a contract value of \$115.4 million. The new site, located in the <u>St. Louis Promise Zone</u> near the <u>University of Missouri – St. Louis (UMSL)</u> campus on Natural Bridge Rd., is the former Immaculate Heart Convent owned by the Sisters of the Good Shepherd since 1874. Last year, the property was sold to the U.S. Federal Properties Co., a firm that specializes

in the development of properties leased to the U.S. federal government.

The St. Louis lab is one of three in the country. This new lab will address present and future public health challenges through science and technology to ensure that our nation's meat, poultry and processed egg supply is safe and properly labeled. Read more.



St. Louis County Library program to offer formerly incarcerated people business skills

The St. Louis County Library is launching a small-business program to help formerly incarcerated people in the region learn how to become entrepreneurs. The Small Business Launchpad, which starts in August, will provide 12 participants with business planning workshops and expert-led sessions about business financing. The program also will teach people how to develop business ideas, understand pricing and prepare marketing materials.

Getting a job after being incarcerated is difficult, so learning about entrepreneurship could help people find another way to success, said Megan Phifer-Davis, St. Louis County Library reference department manager. With your own business, she said, "you get to work towards something that you are excited to do every day." The county library received a \$3,500 grant from the Missouri Library Association to fund the six-month program at the library's Natural Bridge branch. People who come out of prison have a hard time obtaining business loans from banks, Phifer-Davis said.

To help participants overcome that barrier, the program will allow them to consult with Grow with Google business and online training, Great Southern Bank, the financial planning company Justine Petersen and others on how to manage personal and business finances...Learning how to start and grow a business could help formerly incarcerated people gain more economic opportunities, said county library CEO Kristen Sorth. FOCUS ST. LOUIS HONORS BUILD BACK BETTER REGIONAL GRANT

FOCUS ST. Louis hosted their 26th Annual What's Right with the Region Awards on May 11, 2023. Each year, the event honors individuals, organizations and initiatives that are making a positive impact within the St. Louis region. This year, St. Louis Economic Development Partnership (STL Partnership) and Greater St. Louis Inc. accepted an award in the category "Enhancing Regional Prosperity" for their collaboration on the Build Back Better Regional Grant.

The grant, worth \$25 million, will create the Advanced Manufacturing Innovation Center St. Louis (AMICSTL), which will serve as a hub for research, innovation and start-ups. Rodney Crim, CEO and President of STL Partnership and Jason Hall, CEO of Greater St. Louis Inc. accepted the award on behalf of all of the grant partners. Read more.



Mental Health Heroes

St. Louis County Children's Service Fund brings attention and services to the mental health needs of children across St. Louis County

Since 1949, May has been observed in the United States as Mental Health Awareness Month to raise awareness about mental and behavioral health issues and decrease the surrounding stigma. In observance, the nonprofit, St. Louis County Children's Service Fund (CSF), the largest service provider of its kind in Missouri, has been hosting a series of lunch and learns regarding well-being for youth... "Mental Health Awareness Month present[ed] us with a great opportunity to better highlight and address our community's mental health needs," said Emily Koenig, executive director of CSF.

Attendance has been good and has allowed participants to not only gain information about youth and mental health, but also what CSF offers communities....The nonprofit began in 2008 when a group of St. Louis County voters created the nonprofit and governmental entities to provide mental and behavioral health services to children and families. CSF has invested more than \$450 million in organizations [including UMSL mental and behavioral health services] throughout the community using the "Putting Kids First" sales tax, which allocates a quarter-cent of every dollar spent in St. Louis County to its funding for services that include crisis intervention, counseling, child advocacy, education, and prevention. University of Missouri–St. Louis breaks ground on new Richter Family Welcome and Alumni Center

Faculty, staff, alumni, students and supporters of the University of Missouri–St. Louis gathered in Alumni Circle Tuesday afternoon [June 6] to mark the start of construction on the new Richter Family Welcome and Alumni Center. The new 31,000-square-foot center will connect to the J.C. Penney Conference Center and is intended to serve as the gateway to UMSL for prospective students and their families while also providing a permanent home for the university's more than 112,000 alumni.

"The Richter Family Welcome and Alumni Center will be a place to welcome students into the often-confusing world of higher education while simultaneously giving those who've already experienced its transformative power a place to return to and give back," Chancellor Kristin Sobolik said as she addressed a crowd of about 100 people, some of them spilling out from under the shade of a tent on a warm summer afternoon. The idea for the dual-purpose center excited alumnus Kirk Richter nearly two years ago when he and wife Maureen joined Sobolik on another warm summer afternoon for a golf cart tour of the UMSL campus. They discussed several projects to which the alumni couple might lend their financial support. Read more.




Summer Lunches at St. Louis County Libraries
