

Greetings from the President...

Dear Fellow Retirees,

With professional baseball about to begin again and some of Missouri's beautiful trees ready to bloom, the scent of renewal is in the air. This has been a difficult winter financially for many of us and concern about retiree benefits has caused some anxiety, which I hope to reduce.

On March 11th, your representatives met with UM President Gary Forsee and VP Betsy Rodriguez in Columbia. Their comments were reassuring in that although there was a rapid, significant decrease in the UM retirement fund assets, retirement payments are not in jeopardy. Moreover, the importance of maintaining our health care benefits was clearly stated. I was impressed with Forsee's evaluation of the problems facing UM and his planned response to legislative overtures, including some resurrected bills attempting to combine state health care systems. The Retirement Plan Annual Report for 2008 should be on the UM system webpage by the time you receive this. Hopefully, the agreement with Governor Jay Nixon to maintain UM state funding in exchange for not raising tuition will have been approved as well. Federal stimulus funds will have promoted this compromise which is much better than the earlier discussed 15-25% decrease in UM state funding. There will be some challenging years until our state economy improves but preserving UM retiree benefits will be a high priority.

As April 15 approaches, I am reminded of many queries from last year. Questions regarding Missouri tax breaks for pension income may be answered by going to www.umsystem.edu/ums/departments/hr/benefits and reading the letter from the Missouri Department of Revenue and/or from www.moga.mo.gov/statutes/c100-199/1430000124.htm or by consulting your tax advisor. You should ask for form MO-1040P and decide for yourself if you can take advantage of this potential state tax savings.

Our spring luncheon and annual meeting will be on June 9th. I hope the date is convenient for you and that you will plan to attend and perhaps run for a position on the board. Once again, the luncheon is being hosted by Chancellor Tom George.

You also may be interested in the Alumni Weekend, April 17-18. There will be campus tours and other events, see www.umslalumni.org.

At our forthcoming board meeting, we will be discussing updating the directory, gathering email information, and future activities. Please inform me of issues that you wish to have discussed by your representatives.
