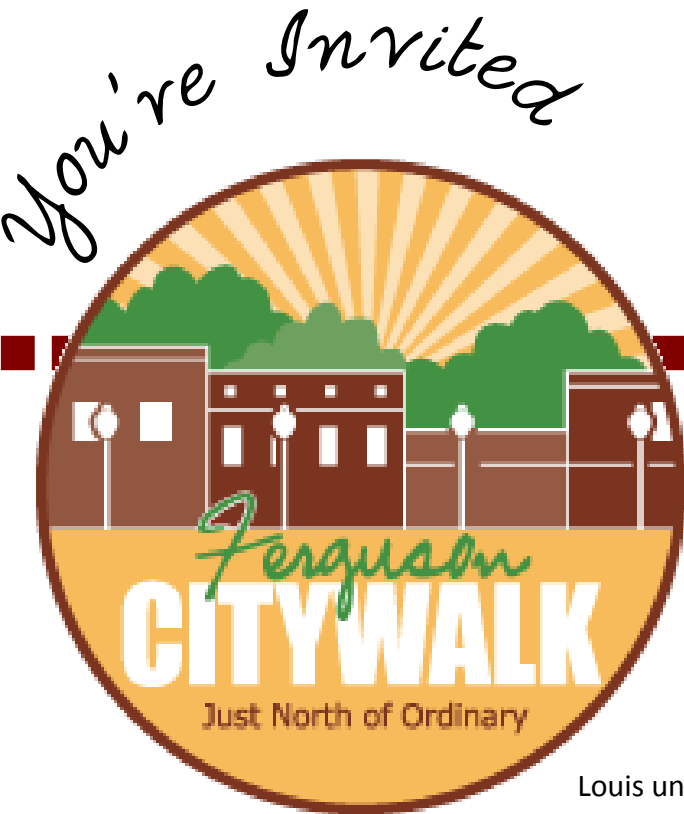


Mini Writing Marathon
