The Bachelor of Arts in Applied Psychology of Child Advocacy Studies

The BA in Applied Psychology of Child Advocacy Studies (AP-CAST) prepares students to be trauma-informed professionals who respond appropriately to experiences of traumatic stress and maltreatment in children and teens. As an applicable, innovative and accessible new degree, this major prepares graduates to move into a variety of child serving sectors. This interdisciplinary program is enhanced by hands-on skill development, immersive learning experiences and mentoring from professionals in the workforce, and is one of the first three majors of its kind in the country.

Upon completion of the BA in Applied Psychology of Child Advocacy Studies, graduates will be able to develop and demonstrate trauma-informed experiential and reasoning skills; apply empirical and conceptual knowledge of traumatic stress; think critically about how to respond to childhood traumatic stress to promote resilience in children and families; create trauma-informed relationships with diverse populations; interact effectively with professionals across disciplines; and advocate for trauma-informed policy changes that promote the well-being of all children, including those which prevent child abuse and secondary traumatic stress.
