RULES FOR GIVING YOUR DEPOSITION

- 1. Always <u>TELL THE TRUTH</u>.
- 2. Don't get angry.
- 3. Treat opposing attorney with respect.
- 4. Don't volunteer information. Answer as briefly as you can and only what is asked.
- 5. Never interrupt the question. Take your time.
- 6. Listen carefully. Pause, then answer.
- 7. Don't guess. If you don't know the answer, say so. If you don't understand the question, say so.
- 8. Watch out for compound question (two or more questions in one). Make the attorney break it down.
- 9. Watch out for questions that assume false facts. Point out the false facts.
- 10. Watch out for questions that give a summary of the facts. Never let the other lawyer put false words in your mouth.
- 11. Don't characterize your testimony. Don't say "honestly", "truthfully", etc.
- 12. Avoid using absolutes like "always", or "never".
- 13. Watch out for "tell me all" questions. Don't get boxed in. Leave the door open so you can add things you may possibly remember later.
 - For example: "I'm sure I might remember other things if I were not so nervous...", or "...if I could review the records."
- 14. Dress neatly and conservatively.
- 15. Remember that your deposition is not a friendly chat. It is an important legal examination that can make or break your case.
